



Animal Care Services

The City of McLendon-Chisholm is partnering with [All American Dogs](#), a private animal control company, to provide McLendon-Chisholm residents routine animal control and emergency response services. Together, the City of McLendon-Chisholm and All-American Dogs promote responsible pet ownership.

About All American Dogs

All American Dogs was founded in 2007 on the principles of customer service, safety, integrity, animal welfare and common sense. Located in Pilot Point, All American Dogs has a high success rate in returning lost animals to their homes. All animals are held for a minimum of 5 days before being placed for adoption.

Services Provided

All American Dogs will respond to routine service calls between 8 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday – Friday. All American Dogs will respond to emergency service calls after hours and on weekends.

Routine service calls include collection of stray animals or deceased animals. Call 972-382-3647 for routine services.

Emergency service calls include response to injured domestic animals when the owner is unknown, domestic animal bites to a human when the owner is unknown and response to aggressive or dangerous animals. Call 972-382-3647 for an emergency service call. If no answer, leave a message with a call back number and nature of the animal emergency and your call will be returned by a representative shortly.

Pet Registration Residents are not currently required to register pets with the city. The city and All-American Dogs encourage residents to keep pet identification tags, microchip information and vaccinations current.

Other Animal Concerns

Livestock Report loose livestock such as cows, horses or goats to the Rockwall County Sheriff's non-emergency number at 972-204-7001.

Coyotes, and Bobcats are common in McLendon-Chisholm and throughout Rockwall County. A sighting is not generally cause for concern. Residents are encouraged to watch small animals while outside especially during the early morning and evening hours to keep domestic small animals safe from predators.
